

This safari highlights the best that Namibia has to offer. From the dramatic sand dunes at Sossusvlei to the lunar landscape of Damaraland and the abundant wildlife in Etosha National Park, it can be seen why the diversity offered makes Namibia one of the most exciting destinations in Southern Africa.

Day 1: Windhoek - Sossusvlei

Starting in Windhoek you will proceed down the great escarpment into the vast Namib Desert to Sossusvlei, an area marked by some of the highest dunes on Earth. Two nights at SOLITAIRE COUNTRY LODGE. (B)

Day 2: Sossusvlei

Today you will see the changing colours of the sands with a sunrise at Sossusvlei. Explore some of the many dunes surrounding Sossusvlei and Dead Vlei, followed by a visit to the 30-metre deep Sesriem Canyon. The afternoon is at leisure. (B)

Day 3: Swakopmund

After breakfast you travel via Kuiseb Moon Valley towards the Atlantic Ocean. In Walvis Bay you will visit the shallow lagoon, one of the most important wetland areas and a world heritage site. Over 80% of the African flamingoes feed in this lagoon. On arrival into the coastal town of Swakopmund, you have the rest of the day at leisure. Two nights SCHWEITZER HAUS. (B)

Day 4: Swakopmund

Day at leisure in Swakopmund. Variety of optional activities are on offer in and around this quaint seaside town (own account). (B)

Day 5: Damaraland

Travel inland past the Brandberg, Namibia's highest mountain into Damaraland. Visit a traditional Damara village, a tribe that, together with the Bushmen, were the original inhabitants of Namibia. Prior to checking into your lodge, visit the burnt mountain and the organ pipes; these geological phenomena are particularly stunning during the late afternoon. Overnight at TWYFELFONTEIN COUNTRY LODGE. (B)

Day 6: Kaokoland

Morning visit to Twyfelfontein World heritage site, to see the bushman painting. Afterwards you will visit the Petrified Forest; then head through to Opuwo, and your lodge. Two nights at OPUWO COUNTRY LODGE. (B)

Day 7: Kaokoland

After breakfast take a full day excursion into the untouched land of the Ovahimba's in northern Kaokoland. Weather permitting a visit to Epupa Falls. Afterwards visit a traditional Ovahimba village before heading back to your lodge. (B)

Day 8: Ovamboland

Travel via Ruacana into the "Region of the four O's". You will visit interesting historical sights, as well as an Oshiwambo tribe local homestead. Overnight OSHAKATI COUNTRY LODGE. (B)

Day 9: Etosha National Park

After an early breakfast you travel into the Etosha National Park. The following two days are devoted to the abundant wildlife found in the park, which surrounds a parched salt desert known as the Etosha Pan. The waterholes support a rich diversity

of mammals and birds. Overnight HALALI RESORT. (B)

Day 10: Etosha National Park

After an early breakfast you travel to the eastern side of the park. In the afternoon travel to your lodge, situated amidst the majestic Otavi Mountains. Rest of day at leisure. Overnight GHAUB GUEST FARM or similar. (B)

Day 11: Tour Ends

After breakfast you travel back to Windhoek and the end of your tour. (B)
